Confirmed speakers:

Hub representative: Kristina Šermukšnytė-Alešiūnienė, director of Agrifood Lithuania, a digital innovation hub which is part of the EDIH Lithuania.lt. The hub worked closely with a small zero-waste farm 50 Acres of Work & Joy to implement a data integration solution AgroSmart.

Company representative: Anca Sandu, managing partner of UnitH2B, an architecture and engineering firm based in Romania. The company worked closely with FIT EDIH and a BIM Association in Romania to improve how they use BIM in their office. During the experiment, the company tested a total of 13 BIM use cases, had several working meetings with the hub and the association as well as tested some of the lessons learned in a collaboration with other architecture offices when implementing a project.
